5.1 Disadvantaged Unincorporated Community Mapping and Identification and Policy Development

LAFCO Counsel: Policy from

2012 is very clear on the meaning of a DUC but the current policy is not. Potential changes

Commissioner Gore: What brought this about?

Commissioner Lowe: Are other LAFCOs struggling with this DUC investigation/policy as well? Do city driven annexations differ from developers regarding the annexation of DUCs?

Commissioner Holmer: Census designated places vs census tracks vs census blocks? Would using blocks help address that problem? Housing in one area vs another due to home prices.

LAFCO Counsel: LAFCO definition incorporated commission policy as well as the water tracker (slightly different categories)

LAFCO Counsel: Different definition of DUC for cities than for LAFCO

Commissioner Gorin: The census tracks in the springs are divided by Hwy 12 have a different income level than those other DUCs in south Santa Rosa. Census blocks vs census tracks, etc.

Commissioner Okrepkie: What about a private landowner? Everything follows the same rules.

Fred Allebach: Likes the idea of working on the DUC policy which will be open to public input. FB 244 clause. Different tools (District R) available to the public to differentiate the DUCS along with the median income, etc. Could an annexation split a DUC. Census track vs block groups.

Commissioner Kapolchok: Questions for staff?

Commissioner Okrepkie: Would like to see the DUCs be as granular (as reasonable) as possible.

Commissioner Gore: Would like to give it back to Staff

Commissioner Lowe: Having a tool/maps. Could defer to policy committee for the definitions of things i.e. adjacent. Good start to reach out to other counties/LAFCOs for input.

Commissioner Holmer: Defining DUCs as accurately as possible. See that public services are adequately provided to all. Sub-committee beneficial to staff – then so be it. Striving for the most accuracy possible.

Commissioner Kapolchok: Income levels? Other resources available: development commissions, agencies, housing programs in terms on census results in certain communities.

5.2 Preliminary Review of City of Santa Rosa Municipal Service Review and Sphere of Influence Study Environmental Review: Exempt pursuant to State CEQA Guideline Sections 15306 and15061 (b)(3) Commissioner Hemmendinger: Financial issues regarding the vague language that is used and wanted more specificity in a future document. Not looking at the opportunity for shared services – not completed? City of SR needs to talk to Sonoma County Fire to ensure cost efficiency. Note on the population data as to why they are accepting the apag data when the reality of the report is the opposite.

Commissioner Kapolchok: Population projections did not make sense.

Commissioner Holmer: Two different studies: MSR and SOI. When do we look at agricultural impacts, open space and ability of the public infrastructure to support what is going into the area. SOI in place insinuates that annexations are going to occur. Need for public services without the demands that are necessary in the amended sphere territory. No or little mention of agricultural and open space issues/impacts. SOI portion needs work.

Commission Okrepkie: Regarding the fire stations etc. there is an influx of funds coming to the city/fire. Population growth development could be attributed to re-locations due to the fires, ADU units to increase potential population growth.

If you or your agent has made a contribution of \$250 or more to any Commissioner or Alternate Commissioner during the 12 months preceding the decision, that Commissioner or Alternate Commissioner must disgualify himself or herself from the decision in the proceeding. However, disgualification is not required if the Commissioner or Alternate Commissioner returns that campaign contribution within 30 days of learning both about the contribution and the fact that you are a participant in the proceedings. Pursuant to Government Code Sections 56700.1 and 81000 et seq., any person or combination of persons who directly or indirectly contributes \$1,000 or more or expends \$1,000 or more in support of or in opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that will be or has been submitted to the Sonoma Local Agency Formation Commission must comply, to the same extent as provided for local initiative measures, with reporting and disclosure requirements of the California Political Reform Act of 1974.
